In June and July of 2007 a Waging Peace researcher conducted a three week fact-finding mission in Eastern Chad about the crisis in Darfur. While collecting testimonies, she gave children aged 6-18 paper and pencils and asked them about their dreams for the future and their memories from the past. *Drawings from Darfur* is a collection of these children's drawings and testimonies, which depict memories of the shocking atrocities committed against these young witnesses.
