Jane B. O'Connell is President of the Altman Foundation, a \$240 million foundation established in 1913 under the will of Benjamin Altman, whose dry goods store, B. Altman & Co., was a New York institution.

The Altman Foundation is dedicated to bettering the lives of New Yorkers through grants to education, health, for strengthening communities and to arts and cultural institutions in the five boroughs of New York City.

Mrs. O'Connell served as Director of Development and Administrative Services at an independent girls school from 1976 to 1998 and now consults for a number of schools and non-profits. She serves on the board of the New York Chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals, New York Chapter, and the board of

Governance Matters (formerly the Alliance for Nonprofit Governance). She was a trustee of City Harvest for twelve years and chaired its Human Resources Committee. She is a trustee of the Lavelle Fund for the Blind and the Endowment for Inner-City Education and chairs its disbursement committee. She also serves as a trustee of Early Steps, a program that assists minority families in admission to independent schools. She is a member of the Advisory Board for the Fundraising Management Program a division of the Continuing Education Program at Columbia University.

Mrs. O'Connell is a graduate of Manhattanville College and received her M.A. in Secondary Education from New York University School of Education.
